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**AUASI SMALL BOAT HARBOR  
ISLAND OF TUTUILA, AMERICAN SAMOA**

**Project Location.** Auasi is located on the southeastern shoreline of Tutuila opposite the island of Aunuu.

**Authorization.** The project was authorized under Section 107 of the Rivers and Harbors Act of 1960, as amended. The harbor is one of the two harbors serving as navigation end points between Tutuila and Aunuu islands.

**Local Sponsor.** The local sponsor is the American Samoa Government.

**Completed Work.** The Corps completed construction of the harbor in March 1981 at a total cost of \$1,095,936 (COE: \$955,213; coast guard: \$47,076; non-federal: \$93,647). The completed project consists of an entrance channel 360 feet long, 80 feet wide and 10 feet deep; a turning basin 230 feet long, 100 feet wide and 8 feet deep; a breakwater 125 feet long; an exterior revetment 165 feet long; an east jetty 100 feet long; a west jetty 450 feet long; and aids to navigation.

**Present Status.** Repairs to the revetted mole, wave absorber, and east jetty were accomplished in 1985, 1989, and 1993. Total operation and maintenance cost to date is \$547,556. The repair work at Auasi Harbor consists of resetting the armor stones in the west jetty structure. A repair contract was awarded in November 1997 for \$45,000 and completed in March 1998.
