INFORMATION PAPER

SUBJECT: Highway Revetments for Talofofu, Inarajan and Adelup, Guam

1. Purpose: To provide information on the subject project.
2. Points of Major Interest and Facts.

a. Department of Public Works administers the highway system in Guam with funds provided by Federal Highway Administration (FHWA). The funding source for the projects identified below is the FHWA's Emergency Relief funds from Typhoon Paka. Design funds from the Government of Guam were received on 27 August 2003, totaling \$480,000.

b. The scope of the Honolulu District's work will be to provide design, contracting and construction management services. Identified projects are to construct revetments along the shoreline to protect the highway.

c. Identified projects are:

(1) Adelup Shore Protection. Provide approximately 1,200 feet of revetment along the shoreline to protect the highway near the Governor's complex at Adelup. Project cost is estimated at \$1,700,000.

(2) Talofofu Bay Shore Protection. Provide approximately 650 feet of revetment to protect the highway between the Talofofu Park and mouth of Talofofu River. Project cost is estimated at \$1,650,000.

(3) Inarajan Shore Protection. Provide approximately 850 feet of revetment along the shoreline to protect the highway through the village of Inarajan. Project cost is estimated at \$1,520,000.

3. Congressional Interest. There is minimal Congressional interest in these projects, at this time.
