 - The review area is comprised entirely of dry land (i.e., there are no waters or water features, including wetlands, of any kind in the entire review area). Rationale: A site visit was conducted to determine if waters of the United States are present in the area where improvements to a drainage ditch located at Benjamin Parker Elementary School in Kanehohe, HI are proposed. The ditch is used as stormwater runoff to prevent flooding in the soccer field adjacently located. The site visit was conducted on February 26, 2021 at 1100 on a partly cloudy day. The channel inside the drainage ditch was completely dry and had trash strewn throughout. The site had a slight change in slope from the field down to the drainage ditch. In conclusion, based on 33 CFR 328.3 (b)(5) Ditches that are not waters identified in paragraph (a)(1) or (2) of this section, and those portions of ditches constructed in waters identified in paragraph (a)(4) of this section are non-jurisdictional waters. The Corps determination of the Benjamin Parker Elementary School drainage ditch site is that it consists of a drainage ditch with the sole purpose of stormwater run off and was built in uplands and does not contain wetlands, streams, or other waters regulated by the Corps.
