

USACE hosts public meetings for WMA Program munition response sites Sector 16 and 17

FORT SHAFTER, Hawaii, (Oct. 18, 2023) - The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, responsible for managing restoration efforts at the Former Waikoloa Maneuver Area, South Kohala, Island of Hawaii, is holding two public meetings Wednesday, Oct. 25 to present the remedial investigation plans for Munitions Response Sites Sector 16 and Sector 17.

Sector 17 A-F, Project 21: Oct. 25 at 10 a.m. at the Mauna Kea Resort, Kauna'oa Ballroom (62-100 Kauna'oa Drive, Kohala Coast, HI 96743) *A virtual option is available.* (See attached map)

Sector 16 A-E, Project 20: Oct. 25 from 5 to 6:30 p.m. at Waimea Elementary School Cafeteria (67-1225 Hawai'i Belt Rd. Waimea, HI 96743) *A virtual option is available.* (See attached map)

During this phase of the CERCLA process, contracted field teams will be collecting data to determine the nature and extent of munitions use. Activities will include vegetation clearance to facilitate access and use of digital geophysical mapping and handheld metal detectors. Hand digging of potential items may be necessary in some areas which may require resident evacuations. USACE and contract representatives will present details on the remedial investigation schedule and methodology. Representatives from Hawai'i Department of Health and the contractor will also be available to answer questions. The public is encouraged to attend in-person or online.





Sector 17 A-F, Project 21, a Formerly Used Defense Site, is 6,874.6 acres in the western area of the Former Waikoloa Maneuver Area, bounded to the west by the Pacific Ocean, to the east by Queen Ka'ahumanu Highway, to the north by Kawaihae Road, and extends south to Anaehoomalu Bay.



Sector 16 Map:

Sector 16 A-E, Project 20 a Formerly Used Defense Site, is 6,600.9 acres in the northwest section of the WMA adjacent to Kawaihae Road which forms the southern boundary. The northern boundary is the Kohala foothills. The western extent is at Kawaihae Harbor and the Pacific Ocean to the east the town of Waimea.
